Man's Radical Falleness

Glimmerings of Natural light (Canons 3/4; 4) Genesis 2:7

1. Body:

- Created out of the dust of the ground as were the animals (Genesis1:24).
- Man is an integral part of this earthly creation. He depends on creation for its air, food, etc.
- Man is related most closely to the animals since they too were created out of the dust of the earth.

2. Soul (spirit):

- Man was created with a **mind** (Job 32:8). He has intellect, knowledge and understanding. He is a rational being. He is able to memorize, recall, and deduce. He has reasoning.
- Man was created with a will. He is a volitional being. Man has certain desires or wants that can be the motivation behind his actions. Feelings are an aspect of this gift in man.

Note:

- 1. Man's soul is synonymous with his spirit. The spirit is not a separate faculty in a man.
 - Compare Ecclesiastes 12:7 to Revelation 6:9
 - Job 32:8, I Corinthians 2:11
- 2. The soul is referred to as a spirit because by virtue of our mind and will man is a spiritual being, that is, he knows by nature that there is a a spiritual realm other than and earthly.
 - Knows there is a God that must be served (Romans 1:19, 20)
 - Knows there is right and wrong (Romans 2:14, 15)
 - Knows there is life after death (every pagan religion testifies of this).

Moral/Ethical Darkness - the Image of Satan (?) John 8:44; Ephesians 2:2; Canons 3/4;1

- 1. Lost the true knowledge of God and in its place entailed blindness of mind, darkness and perverseness of judgment. Colossians 3:9, 10; Canons 3/4; 1
 - His understanding was darkened and blinded. Ephesians 4:18.
 - Though knowing there is a God, man no longer feared God or loved him (Romans 3:11-18). He became an enemy of God. Romans 5:10; Ephesians 2:2
 - The thoughts of man's heart were only evil continually (Genesis 6:5).
- 2. Lost his righteousness and became wicked (unrighteous) and rebellious. Ephesians 4:22-24; Canons 3/4; 1
 - Man refuses to walk in God's commandments. Romans 8:7
 - Though retaining the ability to choose, from a spiritual point of view man was so enslaved to sin that he would always choose against God and his commandments. Romans 8:7;
- 3. Lost his holiness and became obdurate in heart and will and is impure in his affections. Ephesians 4:22-24; Canons 3/4;1
 - Man now followed after the lusts and desires of his his sinful flesh (Ephesians 2:3).
 - He is past feeling and given over to uncleanness. Ephesians 4:19
 - No longer seeks God but seeks himself. Romans 3:11

Note:

- 1. Died spiritually. Became guilty before God and liable to eternal death (Romans 3:19). Became dead in sins and trespasses total depravity (Ephesians 2:1-5).
- 2. Alienated from God's fellowship and favor. Instead of the object of God's love fallen man became the object of his hatred. Psalms 5:4-5 and 11:5.
